Default State

User encounters command line upon login or after completion of any task

- 1 Prior to user activating control, it appears as empty box
- 2 Once user clicks anywhere in control, cursor immediately appears flush left, blinking as in traditional search box
- 3 Once user starts typing, cursor moves rightward as in traditional search box
- 4 Once user starts typing first character, prompting text may appear right justified to end of the box if there is an autosuggestion term that can be accepted (see 1.1). Text is lightly greyed out, enough to suggest instructions without appearing as if it is entered text. Language TBD.

First Search Phrase Only

User points mouse into search box, clicks to activate and begins to type text. User always has option to type as much text in first field as desired. Autosuggest begins to appear below search box, within 100ms of character entry. Users can arrow down to select desired autosuggest choice; then selecting [TAB] chooses the highlighted line as the resolution for the current search field. The typed characters then change to the selected resolved term, the cursor moves to the following entry field and the process begins again. Selecting [ENTER] without arrowing down executes a keyword search. However, if a 100% confidence top-hit match occurs, the top hit autosuggestion moves to the top of the list and is highlighted, so that if the user selects [ENTER] it will execute the top hit suggestion. Selecting [ENTER] or double-clicking the mouse over any highlighted line acts as a GO command and performs the activity of that line.

NOTE: Width of dropdown varies depending on width of result set. Default is width of command box, but expands rightwards to end of jump buttons if results set is extremely wide.

- 1 As user enters text, dropdown dynamic autosuggest box appears below search box. If no top hit match with 100% confidence exists, then the first autosuggest option is always to search the typed string as a keyword. The second choice is then the Top Hit, if one exists. When top hit appears there will always be a duplicate entry of the suggestion under the Entity type for that suggestion (in this drawing, Walt Disney Company). Selecting [ENTER] without arrowing down executes a keyword search.
- 2 Additional suggested resolutions of the characters typed to that point are displayed on separate lines. As user continues to type characters, the resolution suggestions are updated. Results are grouped by Entity type and are labeled with headers. Results appear in the following order (if no results fit within a particular Entity type that Entity is not displayed): Securities, Views, Portfolios & Lists, People, Industries, Countries, Topics & Keywords.

Suggestions are displayed in two columns. For all Entities except Securities, Views and Countries, the first column is the long name and the second column is the shortcut or additional description. For Securities the first column is the RIC and the second column is "Long Name (Ticker: Exchange)". For Views and Countries, the first column is the shortcut abbreviation and the second column is the full name. Top Hit format for Securities is "Long Name (Entity Type: Ticker)" and Long Name for all other Entities.

- 3 Prompting text appears when there is an autosuggestion option highlighted (either by system or by user). If user enters so much text in box that the cursor reaches the prompting text, the prompting text disappears and the cursor continues to move rightwards. When the cursor reaches 20px before the end of the box, the cursor stops in its current position and newly entered text causes the previously entered text to scroll leftwards.
- 4 Portion of matched term is highlighted in bold. Only 1 part of term is highlighted regardless of multiple matches of text fragment in line. Terms that resolve to the same destination (ex. Ticker symbol and Reuters code) are combined into 1 feedback line with all matching terms combined.
- 5 User can navigate the blue selection box away from the first line to other autosuggest choices by using the up/down arrows or by pointing the mouse. Upon this user navigation, the text in the command line changes to match the term highlighted, using the data in the first column of the result (i.e. a Securities highlight resolves to the RIC). [ENTER] then appears in the blue line as a prompt. Selecting [ENTER] or clicking the mouse executes the action. If the user arrows back up into the command box, the text reverts to what the user originally typed.
- 6 If there exists a top hit match within 100% confidence, this choice is always presented in the first line with blue highlighting and an [ENTER] prompt. Selecting [ENTER] will then execute this suggestion. Users can still arrow down to select another choice, which still behaves like Note 5.

Views State

User has tabbed to accept a highlighted suggestion. Resolved suggestion term appears in the first field. Cursor moves to next field. If user has not entered any text in this field after approximately 500ms this autosuggestion state is displayed. This state exists when a resolved term has associated views with it.

- 1 User has typed text in first field. Upon selecting [TAB], system resolves typed in text to the choice that user selected, surrounding it in a grey background field. Cursor moves into next field.

Other key commands from this point:

[LEFT] moves cursor to the left of the resolved entity. Adding text at this point is an AND command with the resolved Entity in that field.

[SHIFT + LEFT] selects the resolved Entity (here DIS.N)

[BACKSPACE] unresolves the Entity and returns the text to what the user originally typed before the resolution.

- 2 If user pauses and does not enter text in field 2, and term in field 1 has associated views with it, these views are displayed in a dynamic dropdown. There is a header for the section called "Views for [ENTITY NAME]". If this process occurs in third or fourth field and there is more than 1 resolved entity terms in the search query so far, then the header is "Views for [ENTITY NAME 1 + ENTITY NAME 2 + ENTITY NAME X]". For companies the views are:
Overview, All Headlines, News, Research, Filings, Events, Today, Graph, Demo, Balance Sheet.

The shortcut key to the destination follows the view name. See Damien Islam-Frenoy for list of all destinations associated with other Entities. Terms are displayed according to their relevance as learned by system of user's past behavior. See Damien for initial default orders.

User may use mouse pointer or UP and DOWN arrows to highlight desired view. Selecting [ENTER] or clicking the mouse over highlighted line performs highlighted action. Selecting [TAB] over a highlighted line adds the selection to the second field and restarts process in third field.

- 3 Left edge of dynamic dropdown realigns directly underneath divider between last two active fields
- 4 When user highlights a line in the dropdown, the prompting text appears flush right in the command box.

Multiple Search Phrases With No Resolved Term(s)

User has selected "Search for ..." suggestion from the dropdown and then [TAB] to accept it and cursor moves to next field. User then types additional text in second field. Same process applies to all remaining fields when no terms are resolved by the system into Entities.

- 1 Upon selecting [TAB], cursor moves into next field. User can then type additional text. Process can be repeated to additional field(s) ad infinitum.
- 2 Left edge of dynamic dropdown realigns directly underneath divider between last two active fields
- 3 If text in box reaches a point 20 px to the left of the prompting text, then the prompting text disappears and user can continue to type. When the cursor reaches 20px to the left end of the entire box, the cursor freezes and the entered text begins to scroll leftwards.
- 4 Highlighting and selection rules behaves identically as described in 1.1 Note 5
- 5 Autosuggestions continue to update as user enters more text

Multiple Search Phrases With Resolved Term(s)

User has selected an Entity suggestion from the dropdown and then selects [TAB] to accept it and cursor moves to next field. User then types additional text in second field, third field, etc.. Process applies to any situation where there is at least one system resolved term in search string.

- 1 Upon selecting [TAB], first term resolves and is surrounded by a grey box and cursor moves into next field. Process can be repeated to additional fields ad infinitum. If text in box reaches a point 20 px to the left of the prompting text, then the prompting text disappears and user can continue to type. When the cursor reaches 20px to the left end of the entire box, the cursor freezes and the entered text begins to scroll leftwards.
- 2 Left edge of dynamic dropdown realigns directly underneath divider between last two active fields
- 3 Top Hit suggestion appears first when there is an exact match and is highlighted; 'Search for' suggestion then appears second. If no exact Top Hit match exists, 'Search for' remains in first position and a Top Hit (not exact match), if any, appears second. Highlighting behaves identically as described in 1.1 Note 5
- 4 Autosuggestions continue to update as user enters more text

Search Results

User has entered search terms in the command line and selected [GO], or has clicked on an item in the dynamic dropdown list. The system then performs a search and displays results. First 50 results displayed with scroll bar; when user reaches end of list, next batch of results fetched.

- 1 When results display, command line box returns to default (empty) state. Current view with shortcut cues appears as link below command line.
- 2 Jump button reserved for Favorites function. Clicking on jump button will display dropdown of current favorites. Jump button will have capability to add, delete and reorder favorites.
- 3 Entity bar displays all the terms of the query (properly resolved if accepted by user in command line). Sub-title bar title is "Search Results".
- 4 System displays terms that are being searched upon, properly resolved out. Clicking on the X removes that term from the search and redispays result set. Selecting Refine button reveals entry bar (see 2.0b) to allow refinement; then selecting ADD adds that term to the list and further filters the search results by that term. LIcon starts 'set alert' starts process to set alert for this query. Disc icon starts 'save search' process for this query. Advanced link reveals advanced search panel. Time Period dropdown defaults to Last 12 Months. User can define time period searched upon by selecting other time period from dropdown and selecting GO. Then results are repulled and displayed. If user selects 'custom range' then 'from' and 'to' fields along with calendar icon appear. See 2.2 for display of latest (realtime) results.
- 5 Entity quick view. Panel only appears if there is a resolved Entity term in the query. If query contains more than one Entity, panel is tabbed to show each Entity. Panel shows title, realtime quick data and up to top 3 destinations for that Entity. First destination should always be Overview. Other destinations varies depending on Entity type and query. The quick data includes:
 Company: RT Price, open/high/low, day range, 52wk range, volume, avg. volume; avg. analyst recommendation. Destinations: Overview, Chart, News.
 Portfolio: Indices – S&P, Dow, Nasdaq Comp: Last, Net Change, %Change. Destinations: My Portfolios, News
 People: Headshot photograph, Employer, company/sector covered (if known), email, phone. Destinations: Overview
 Country: Local main stock exchange last, net change, %change, volume, 10 yr bond yield last, local currency/USD. Destinations: Overview, News, Equities
 Industry: Associated index last, net change, %change, volume; top and bottom performers name/symbol, % change. Destinations: Overview, Constituents, news
- 6 Potential Tasks tiles – System-generated suggested views based on algorithm comparing tags of individual search results to universe of data points within query's Entity components. Functionality TBD. For purposes of demo, display tile with preview thumbnail and task title.
- 7 Entity results. Appears only if there are matched entity results. Area contains tabs for each entity type. Active tab title is bolded; tabs appear in fixed order as displayed, but display only if there is content for the tab; default position is showing results for first tab. Clicking on tab brings selected tab to the front. Up to 3 rows of content are displayed per panel, including line wrapping (spacing TBD). Matched section of query is bolded. If more results exist, more button appears in bottom of panel, clicking which sends user to full Entity results page (see 2.4).

Search Results

User has entered search terms in the command line and selected [GO], or has clicked on an item in the dynamic dropdown list. The system then performs a search and displays results. First 50 results displayed with scroll bar; when user reaches end of list, next batch of results fetched.

- 8 Hot in this search: section shows most popular People, Companies, Topics by publication or readership heat. Bars show no numbers, only convey relative heat. Each line is a link. Upon user click, search is refined by that term and term is added to Entity bar title. Results are then filtered by that term and the control is revalued according to what is now hot in the result set that remains.
- 9 Meta Control functionality. Always appears in same line as Text Results header. Group by defaults to None. User can also select to group by Content Type, Company or Country, which will group results as shown in 2.1 Detail level radio buttons only display when results are filtered to a single content type; defaults to Expanded; if user selects Grid, see 2.3 series by content type. Sort by sorts results by relevancy or time (latest first); default is by relevancy. Show Realtime link launches realtime headlines table (see 2.2).
- 10 Text Results (short display). Section title includes total number of results. Default order by most recent first. Matched query terms display in bold. Headline title links to document; rolling over title changes its color. Sub title shows content type (color coded); Date and Time; Company associated with text result from object's metadata. See 2.0c for specific display requirements by content type. Then short text maximum 200 characters. On right side displays document type icon (with type of document received when user clicks on link displayed in unique manner) as well as icons for other feed types such as video or RSS, if appropriate – clicking on the icon takes user to that content type for that result. Right area also shows tags (max 3, if more then ellipsis). Rolling over short text dynamically expands result into expanded display (see below); when cursor leaves expanded display, result contracts back.
- 11 Filter accordion control panel. See 2.0b for detailed interactions. Default position is Time Period element open and all other elements in closed position. Only one section can be open at a time. User can click on bar to open another fold of accordion. Scroll bar can appear inside fold if too many items. In each section is a list of filter criteria, including 'All' with checkboxes indicating which filters the query employed, a number count indicating how many results contain that filter item and 'only' link to select only that criteria. Default position is for all checkboxes to be checked. Selecting 'only' link next to any filter item filters reruns result set by that item only, and unchecks all other checkboxes except that item. Actual filter criteria names TBD.
- 12 Controller to open/close left drawer. Default position is drawer open with icon showing to close. User click on controller closes individual drawer, changes controller to 'open icon'.
- 13 Individual search result – text (expanded display). When user mouses over short text result, result dynamically expands to show full result and pushes remaining results downward. Expands text to 400 characters. Shows links pulled from inside document (if available) for relevant document navigation and content links. Displays all tags associated with document. Displays link to Share (functionality TBD).
- 14 Related Items. Displays as links. Group according to format as shown: first display results containing all query terms, then display results containing one or more but not all query terms. Then display related orthogonal terms (spelling, by tag analysis, by semantic analysis, etc.). Total maximum displayed items no more than 10.

In the following specifications: single quotations (' ') are used to denote the names of the fields that should be pulled to populate the area. Other punctuation is meant to always be displayed in the result. In all cases, bolded text is reserved for direct matches of the query terms. For all body text snippets, unexpanded result pulls 200 characters maximum; expanded result pulls 400 characters maximum. For all headlines and sub-headlines there is no truncation.

Deleting Query Terms via Entity Bar (alternate version)

Instead of managing the search query terms from the left control panel, this alternate version depicts the process to delete the query terms via the Entity bar. To start the process, the user has typed a series of query terms, as a combination of free text and/or by accepting autosuggestions, and then selects the [GO] button, or mouse clicks or selects [ENTER] when over a highlighted line in the autosuggest dropdown.

1 User has typed text in command box. Text can either be free text keywords and/or resolved Entities through using the [TAB] button in the autosuggest dropdown. User then selects [GO], or mouse clicks or selects [ENTER] from a highlighted line in the autosuggest dropdown.

2 Query terms display in Entity bar separated by [+] signs. Securities Entities are displayed in the format "RIC (Long Company Name)"; all other Entities are displayed using their long name. Keywords are displayed surrounded by quotation marks ("---"). Search results display in content area as shown in 2.0

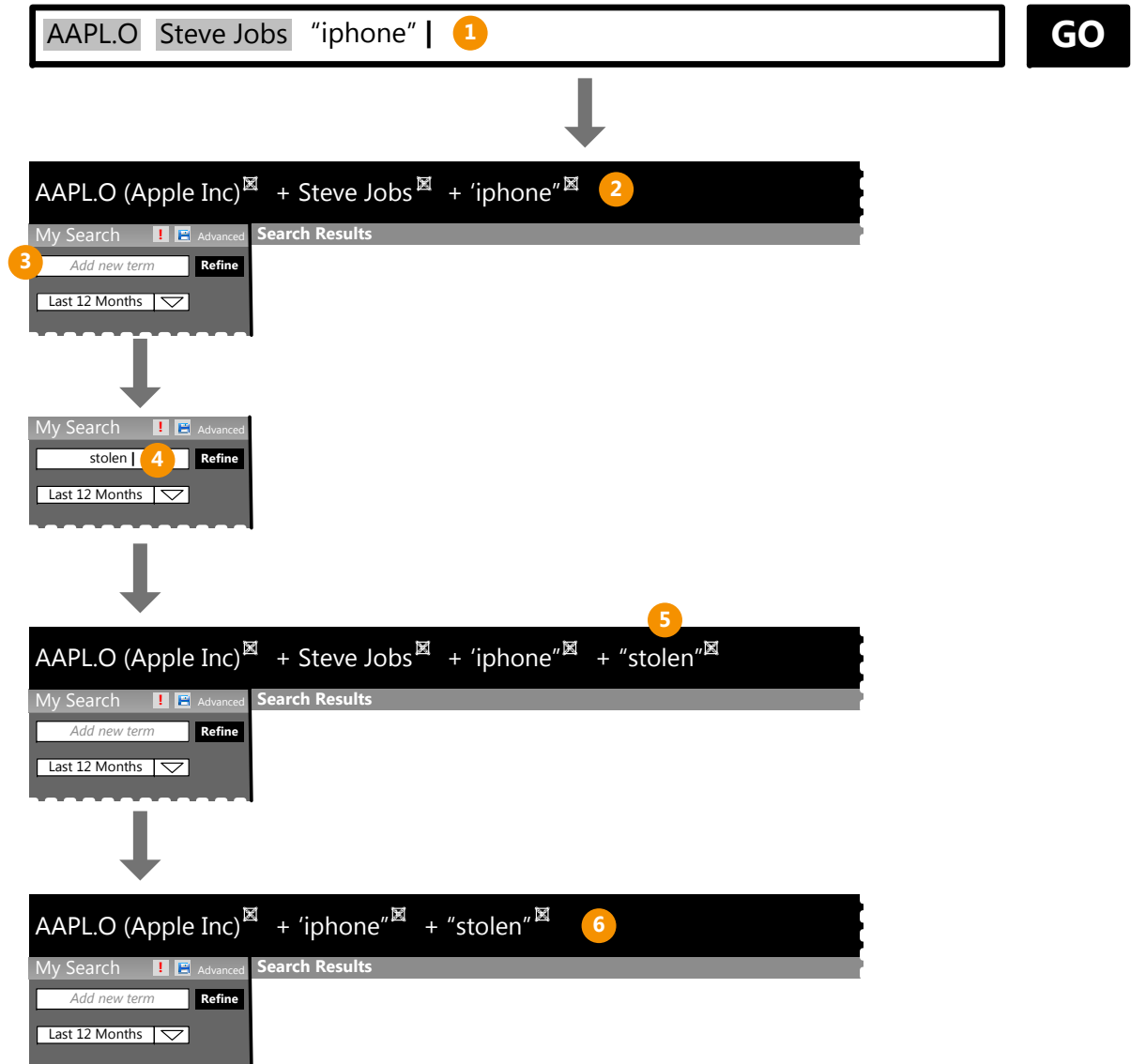
After each query term appears a graphical box representing a control to 'delete' the term from the query. The box needs to be of a distinct enough look that it does not appear to be part of the query term itself. The control also has a rollover state which has a different visual look.

3 In left control panel, My Search area contains a form box to add new terms to the query.

4 User can enter new text in the entry box. All entered text will be treated as a single string. The user then selects [REFINE] to execute.

5 The text the user entered is added to query as a new keyword term. The term is displayed in the Entity bar in quotations marks along with a delete control as per note 2. The search re-executes and results are displayed in the content area as shown in 2.0. The 'add new term' entry box clears out and returns to its initial state.

6 If the user selects a delete control by clicking on it, the control box and the query term associated with it disappear from the Entity bar. In this wireframe example, the user has deleted 'Steve Jobs'. The remaining query terms to the right of the deleted term in the Entity bar, if any, shift over leftwards to take the deleted term's position. The search then re-executes with the remaining query terms and results are displayed in content area as shown in 2.0





Results Grouped

After system has returned results to a search query, the user can group the text results by using the grouping dropdown control in the same line as the Headline Results header. The user may sort/group the results by Company, Content Type or Country.

- 1 During any grouping action, the display of the left control panel, quick results panel and the Entity results are not affected.
- 2 For each grouping action, results are repolled by system. Category headings indicate the types of content followed by a number in parenthesis which indicates the total number of results of that type. Inside each category, up to the first 5 results are initially shown for each category. Categories are only shown when results are available. For Content Type, the categories are shown in this order: News, Significant Developments, Research, Filings, Street Events, People Descriptions, Company Descriptions. For groupings by Company the categories are shown alphabetically. For groupings by Country, the user's preferred location is displayed first, followed by the rest of the world in alphabetical order. Twisties appear next to each category header to allow users to open or close that category.

Default position for the twisties is for the first category (i.e. News, the first Company, or the user's default country) to start open with the other twisty categories closed. Individual results are displayed in the same manner as in 2.0. Rollover expansion of a result to show detailed result is not affected by grouping. If user switches back to non-grouped view (group by none) system refetches the results to be displayed. Similarly, changing from one grouped view to another grouped view refetches the results to be displayed according to the new rules.
- 3 After grouping, to see more results, user has 2 links available at the end of each category. 'Show 10 more' fetches the next 10 results and adds them to the end of the currently displayed list. Then the 2 links again show at the end of this list. If the user clicks 'Show only [category name]' then the system fetches all results for that category and adds them to the end of the displayed list and displays only that category and no other categories. No links are then displayed at the end of this list.

Realtime Results

After system has returned results to a search query, the user can choose to pull realtime updates to the query, by selecting the link 'Show Realtime' next to the Headline Results header.

1 During any realtime results action, the display of left side control panel is not affected. The quick results panel remains only if it had already contained realtime data, which continues to update.

2 If the user selects 'Show Realtime' the Entity results area disappears, the entire Headline Results section moves upward and the 'Show Realtime' link disappears. At the beginning of the Headline results section, the realtime results table is added to the display. In the table, the most recent items are displayed first pushing older items downward. The table has a fixed height and contains its own scroll bar. In the header of the table are controls to pause the realtime updates and an X to delete the entire table. If the user selects 'pause' the control changes to 'resume' and the updates are paused. If the user then selects resume, the system fetches all results that were published since the app was paused and continues to add new results in realtime. The app is not affected by any Group by dropdown action.

Data in the table shows the time of publishing (in the user's preferred location), the type of content, and a clickable headline. The headline changes color upon rollover to indicate it is a link. Clicking on any headline takes the user to the respective document.

3 Results fetched by the system prior to the realtime app activation are not affected by the app and behave according to 2.0

Results Grid View (Filings)

After system has returned results to a search query and the user has filtered down to only a single content type via the left hand panel, the user may then change the granularity of the content display by toggling between the 'expanded' (default) view and the 'grid' view (displayed here), which gives a tabular high level summary of the results.

1 Switching to the Grid View does not affect the display of the left control panel. However, any quick results panel and Entity results areas are deleted and the Headline Results content moves upwards. Toggling back to the 'expanded view' will repoll the results and display as shown in 2.0. The 'Show realtime' link and the 'Group by' dropdown also disappear. The view radio button indicates the user is in Grid View.

2 In the Grid view, the sort by relevance/time function becomes a checkbox to only sort by relevance. Default is for this box to be unchecked. If user checks box, the results are repolled and are displayed in relevance order, most relevant at the top.

3 When the detail level radio button is selected to 'grid', results are displayed in grid view. Default sort is by Filing Date with the most recent item first. Results are sortable by column headers, except for 'Format'.

Infinite scrolling is still active in this view. When user reaches bottom of the scroll, more results are fetched according to the sort rules currently in place at that moment (i.e. sorts by Date, gets next X set of items prior to last shown date; for alphabetical sorts, gets next X set of relevant items and places them in the proper place in the sort.)

4 Selecting a column header changes the background color of the header and makes a up/down twisty available, which lets the user sort by ascending/ descending data in each column. Default sorts: Filing Date – Most recent; Company – alphabetical ascending; Type – alphabetical ascending with numbers (10K, etc.) first; Description – alphabetical ascending; Period End – Most recent; Pages – descending; Language – alphabetical ascending. All clickable fields have rollover change in color state. Ties in sort level (2nd and 3rd level sorts) go by most leftward column not currently sorted first.

Column specific behaviors and data:

Filing Date: Mouseover should show Receipt Date, Time and Time Zone(EST). Time Zone will always be EST. Date Format is mm/dd/yy Time Format is hh:mm AM/PM

Company: Clicking company name will bring up search results page for that company using current criteria.

Filing Type: Types include 10-K, ARS, 8-K, Circular, LISTING, Prospectus, etc. **Descriptions:** Types include Annual Report, Current Event, Prospectus, Annual Financials, etc.

Format: Mouseover should show the DCN# (disclosure control number)

5 Data in Type column is document name. This is a clickable field, with a rollover state of a different color, and clicking on the document takes the user to the document in the most prevalent format type, if there are several format types available.

6 Icons show the types of formats available to view the document in. Most likely types are PDF, Word, Excel, HTML and Paper. Clicking on an individual icon opens the document in the selected format.

More Entity Results

After being presented with results of a search query, the user clicks 'More' from the Entity Results area and is presented with the complete list of Entity results for that type.

- 1 Switching to the More Entity Results view removes any quick results panels as well as all Headline Results. In the left control panel, the time filter criteria is removed.
- 2 Selecting the tab for different types in Entity results from any More Results view will give the user the full results set for that Entity type.
- 3 Selecting 'More' displays the complete list of Entity results for that category, displayed in table format. For each category a different list of table header categories is displayed. Some table headers are sortable and some are not. Certain columns contain clickable data links and some do not. All links change color on rollover. See list below for exact rules:

Column Headers by Entity type (a * before the header name indicates that this column is sortable):

Companies: *Name (clickable link to company overview), *Country, *Sector, *Currency, *RIC, Instruments (list of clickable instrument types (equities, bonds, cds) – clicking on one goes to the instrument-specific view for the company in question)

Funds: *Name, *ISIN, *Lipper Classification, *Fund Type, *Domicile, *Sale Country, *Currency, *Exchange, *RIC

Portfolios: *Name, *Type, Owner (real name, role, company), Benchmark, Constituent #

Indices: *Name, *Exchange, *Issuer, *RIC

People: *Name (FirstName, LastName), Current Positions [(Role, Company), (Role, Company), (Role, Company)...]

When a column is sortable, selecting a column header changes the background color of the header and makes a up/down twisty available, which lets the user sort by ascending/descending data in each column. Default sort is alphabetical ascending for all columns.

Infinite scrolling is still active in this view. When user reaches bottom of the scroll, more results are fetched according to the sort rules currently in place at that moment (i.e. Name gets next X set of Company names in alphabetical order; for all alphabetical sorts, gets next X set of relevant items and places them in the proper place in the sort.)

- 4 For each Entity type, a unique set of navigator folds appear in the accordion panel. Default state is for all checkboxes to be checked, including 'All', and the first fold open. Checkbox filter behavior behaves as in 2.0.

The list of navigators for each Entity type are:

Companies: Country, Sector

Funds: Exchange, Lipper Classification, Fund Type, Domicile, Sale Country, Currency

Portfolios: Type, Owner

Indices: Type, Issuer, Exchange

People: Company, Role
