


What you'll do...



- Perform quantitative analysis on features' performance and find opportunities for optimization


6 Phases of the Software Development Life Cycle







Challenge: Disruptive idea!

What is a Startup?

- Early-stage company
- Founded by entrepreneurs who want to introduce a new product or service
- Characterized by fast pace, high costs, and limited revenue seek funding from investors and venture capitalists



Startup Misconceptions

- A startup will make you rich and famous
 - o 99% of startups fail
 - A startup is a labor of love
- Startups are a long, miserable grind
 - "Do what you love and you'll never work a day in your life"
- Startups are centered around a killer app/the next big thing
 - A startup is a business, not a product; find product-market fit
 - Startups pivot all the time: e.g. Twitter, YouTube
- You can only found a startup in the right environment (i.e. Silicon Valley)
 - Exhibit A: Duolingo; also hybrid work is a thing now
- Startups have a playbook
 - Every founder is doing something new
 - The best resource to learn is not an instruction manual, but other people
